SUBJECT: Public Hearing on Kalani Complex Elementary Schools Consolidation Report

1. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that the Board of Education direct me to hold a public hearing on the attached report on the possible consolidation of elementary public schools in the Kalani complex.

4. DISCUSSION

a. Conditions leading to the recommendation

The Department has prepared a draft report on the possible consolidation of elementary schools in the Kalani complex – Kahala, Liholiho, Lililuokalani, Waiialae, Waikiki, and Wilson. Chapter 8-38, Hawaii Administrative Rules (“Consolidation of Public Schools”) provides that upon receiving the report, the Board shall review the report and direct the superintendent, who shall designate a department official as the hearing officer, to conduct a public hearing within sixty days of the board’s receipt of the report to receive community input on the report. Said report shall be posted on the department’s website and hard copies shall be made available for review at the affected school(s). The superintendent shall notify members of the community of the public hearing by placing a notice in a newspaper of general or area circulation in the State and by such other means as the superintendent determines appropriate.

b. Previous action of the Board on the same or similar matter

The Board's Committee on Administrative Services directed the superintendent on June 7 to hold a public hearing on a draft report on the possible consolidation of schools in the Waialua complex. The public hearing was held on July 7.

d. Arguments in support of the recommendation

The recommendation is in conformance with the procedures for the consolidation of public schools set forth in Chapter 8-38, Hawaii Administrative Rules.

e. Arguments against the recommendation

h. Possible reaction of the public, professional organizations, unions, DOE staff and/or others to the recommendations

While there will be financial implications of the consolidation, there are no financial implications of holding a public hearing other than the cost of publishing a legal notice, printing and posting notices of the public hearing at the three schools, and staff time preparing for, conducting and attending, and reporting on the public hearing.
